

Château de Béro (Béro)

The village of Béro lies well to the east of Chablis, halfway to Tonnerre. It boasts a château whose origins are rooted in the 12th century, though most was rebuilt after a fire in 1640. The de Béro family have lived there since 1627, producing wine until the arrival of phylloxera. Comte Eric de Béro replanted the vineyards from 1987, notably the five-hectare walled Clos Béro; his daughter Athenaïs returned in 2004 to take over, converting the Clos to organic farming. A *premier cru* Vaucoupin is also made.
